A [National Emergency Library](#) was launched by the Internet Archive. Penn State (under Dean Dewey's leadership) and other libraries [supported](#) the Internet Archive's use of Fair Use to eliminate waitlists for the books it lends to users through the latter of June 30, 2020, or the end of the US national emergency.

Its collection includes **over 1.4 million eBooks from the 1920s-1990s**, acquired and digitized by the Internet Archive, that are *not covered by other ebook collections*. It represents the interests of patrons of both academic and public libraries. **It does not include textbooks**. Anyone can set up an account and borrow **for free** for 14 days.
